Cost

The cost is \$40, payable upon making your reservation. Your reservation will be canceled October 1st if we have not received payment. If you cannot come to the Arizona Rosary Celebration, please contact John McNulty as soon as possible - even if it is the day of the event. There are always last minute requests for tables.

About the Tables

The tables are located at the south end of the hall (opposite the stage) in a long row. Nothing can be attached to the walls. There is no electricity or WiFi available.

You may offer items for a donation. Because Arizona Rosary Celebration is a religious service, we get a 40% discount on the cost of the hall; therefore there cannot be any commercial activities. You can put a "suggested donation" on your items, however you must be willing to accept whatever donation is offered.

Timeline

10:00 a.m. You may enter to set up.

12:00 p.m. Doors open at noon for adoration, confession, exhibits/ministry tables.

1:45 p.m. We close the table area for the program. Bring a table cover to discourage attendees from continuing to visit. This will allow the people taking care of the tables to be part of the event and prevents noise during the Arizona Rosary Celebration.

4:15 p.m. The program ends and the ministry table area will be swamped with people. This will last for about 20 minutes. It is worth your time to be ready for the crowd. We keep a strict timetable because so many attendees come on buses and many priests need to be back to their parish for evening Mass.
